Ohio State Parks On The Air



Official Contest Rules

Purpose

To promote public awareness of ham radio and Ohio's beautiful state parks system; to contribute to the recognition that Ohio has a very diverse and wonderful ecology; and to promote camaraderie within the ranks of Ohio's Amateur Radio operators.

Objective

To have competing stations, individual or club, operating from as many of Ohio's seventy-three state parks as possible. Note: Non-Ohio stations may work only Ohio stations located in an Ohio State Park; Ohio stations not located in an Ohio State Park may only contact stations operating from an Ohio State Park.

Contest Period

Saturday, September 6, 2008, from 1600 UTC to 2400 UTC.

Frequencies, Bands and Modes

- All modes: AM, FM, SSB, CW, Digital (Digital = PSK-31, RTTY, etc.) - may be worked on these HF and VHF bands: **80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2** meters.
- Please honor all band plans. All CW contacts must be in the CW portion of the bands.
- No credit for contacts made through repeaters.
- Stations may be worked once per mode on each band; i.e. KD8CKP may be worked on both 40 CW and 40 SSB for point credit.

Entry Categories

- Club Station or Multi-Op low power (10 watts or less) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator low power (10 watts or less) located at an Ohio State Park
- Club Station or Multi-Op high power (11 watts or higher) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator high power (11 watts or higher) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator inside Ohio
- Single Operator or Multi-Op outside of Ohio

Entry Category Definitions:

Single Operator Entry: One person performs all operating and logging functions. Only one transmitted signal is permitted on the air at any time.

Club Station or Multi-Op Entry: Entries where more than one operator performs the operating and logging functions. Multi-operator entries may employ multiple transmitters simultaneously.

Special Category – Clubs may submit a separate entry to compete for the greatest number of Ohio State Parks activated by club members will win this special category. The club activating the greatest number of Ohio State Parks will win this special category. The tiebreaker will be the aggregate scores of member stations.

Exchange

- Stations operating from an Ohio State Park send their call sign, a sequential serial number beginning with 001, "Ohio" and their Ohio State Park Identifier.
Example: "KD8CKP, 001, Ohio, ADA"
- Ohio stations NOT operating from an Ohio State Park send their call sign, a sequential serial number beginning with 001 and "Ohio".
Example: "KD8CKP, 001, Ohio"
- Non Ohio W/VE stations (including KH6/KL7) send a sequential serial number beginning with 001 and their State or Province.
Example: "VE3CKP, 001, Ontario" or "KD4CKP, 001, Georgia"
- DX stations outside of W/VE send a sequential serial number beginning with 001 and "DX".
Example: "XE1CKP, 001, DX"

Scoring

- QSO POINTS - Each complete non-duplicate contact is worth one point.
- MULTIPLIERS - Multipliers are the **73** Ohio State Parks.
- FINAL SCORE - Multiply QSO points by the total number of multipliers.



Miscellaneous

- Callsigns and exchanged information must be received and confirmed by both stations for a complete QSO.
- No cross-mode contacts. CW contacts must be made in the CW portions of the band.
- No station may claim simultaneous operation of the same call sign in more than one Ohio State Park.
- Any transmitter used to contact one or more stations may not be subsequently used under any other callsign during the contest period, with the exception of family stations where more than one callsign is assigned. Under these circumstances, no individual shall make a QSO utilizing more than one callsign.
- Decisions of the Ohio State Parks On The Air Committee are final.

Reporting

- Logs must clearly indicate Serial Number Sent, UTC time, Band, Mode, Call Sign Contacted, Serial Number Received, State/DX, and Ohio State Park Identifier received for all QSOs. A scoring summary sheet must be included with all paper logs showing entrant's callsign, operating location, mailing address, and claimed score. All entries must use the official OSPOTA park identifiers for logging and the received exchange from Ohio stations.
- Paper logs must be sent to the address listed below and must be postmarked no later than 30 days after the end of the contest.
- Paper entry forms and operating aids (rules, summary sheets, log sheet, Ohio State Park identifiers, and other information) are available for downloading in PDF format from the Ohio State Parks On The Air web site at: <http://parks.portcars.org>
- Logs that have been received will be listed on the Ohio State Parks On The Air web site.
- Final results will be posted on the Ohio State Parks On The Air web site.

Awards

- Certificates will be awarded to the top five entries in each category.
- Additional prizes may be awarded for top finishers. Watch the Ohio State Parks On The Air website, <http://parks.portcars.org> for updates.
