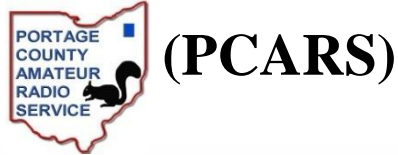

Ohio State Parks On The Air



Official Contest Rules

Purpose

To promote public awareness of ham radio and Ohio's beautiful state parks system; to contribute to the recognition that Ohio has a very diverse and wonderful ecology; and to promote camaraderie within the ranks of Ohio's Amateur Radio operators.

Objective

To have competing stations, individual or club, operating from as many of Ohio's seventy-five state parks as possible. Note: Non-Ohio stations may work only Ohio stations located in an Ohio State Park; Ohio stations not located in an Ohio State Park may only contact stations operating from an Ohio State Park.

Contest Period

Saturday, September 11, 2010, from 1600 UTC to 2400 UTC.

Frequencies, Bands and Modes

- All modes: AM, FM, SSB, CW, Digital (Digital = PSK-31, RTTY, etc.) - may be worked on these HF and VHF bands: **80, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2** meters.
- Please honor all band plans. All CW contacts must be in the CW portion of the bands.
- No credit for contacts made through repeaters.
- Stations may be worked once per mode on each band; i.e. K8BF may be worked on both 40 CW and 40 SSB for point credit.

Please use good amateur practices and consideration - do not cause interference

Entry Categories

- Club Station or Multi-Op low power (10 watts or less) located at an Ohio State Park
- Club Station or Multi-Op high power (11 watts or higher) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator low power (10 watts or less) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator high power (11 watts or higher) located at an Ohio State Park
- Single Operator inside Ohio
- Single Operator outside of Ohio

Entry Category Definitions:

Single Operator Entry: One person (one call sign) performs all operating and logging functions. Only one transmitted signal is permitted on the air at any time.

Club Station or Multi-Op Entry: Entries where more than one operator performs the operating and logging functions. Multi-operator entries may employ multiple transmitters simultaneously. One call sign used.

Exchange

- Stations operating from an Ohio State Park send their call sign, "Ohio" and their Ohio State Park Identifier.

Example: "K8BF, Ohio, ADA"

- Ohio stations NOT operating from an Ohio State Park send their call sign and "Ohio".

Example: "K8BF, Ohio"

- Non Ohio W/VE stations (including KH6/KL7) send their State or Province.

Example: "KD4BF, Georgia" or "VE3BF, Ontario"

- DX stations outside of W/VE send "DX".

Example: "XE1BF, DX"

Scoring

- QSO POINTS - Each complete non-duplicate contact is worth one point.
- MULTIPLIERS - Multipliers are the 75 Ohio State Parks.
- FINAL SCORE - Multiply QSO points by the total number of multipliers.



Example:

K8BF operating from Punderson State Park (PUN) -
10 total contacts on 80 meters SSB & CW & Digital
15 total contacts on 40 meters - CW & digital
12 total contacts on 15 meters SSB
Total Contacts = 37
Number of different Ohio State Parks contacted = 10
Total score = 10 x 37 = 370

N3BF operating from home in Pennsylvania -
5 total contacts on 80 meters SSB & CW & Digital (all in Ohio State Parks)
10 total contacts on 40 meters - CW & digital (all in Ohio State Parks)
15 total contacts on 15 meters SSB (all in Ohio State Parks)
Total Contacts = 30
Number of different Ohio State Parks contacted = 10
Total score = 30 x 10 = 300

Miscellaneous

- Callsigns and exchanged information must be received, confirmed and logged by both stations for a complete QSO.
- No cross-mode contacts.
- CW and Digital contacts must be made in the CW portions of the band.
- No station may claim simultaneous operation of the same call sign in more than one Ohio State Park, State or Province.
- No individual shall make a QSO utilizing more than one callsign.
- Club or Multi-operator entries may only use one call sign during the contest.
- Decisions of the Ohio State Parks On The Air Committee are final.

Reporting

- A scoring summary sheet **MUST** be included with all logs (mailed in entries, or e-mailed entries) showing entrant's callsign, operating location, mailing address, and claimed score. All entries must use the official OSPOTA park identifiers for logging and the received exchange from Ohio stations.
- Logs must clearly indicate UTC time, Band, Mode, Call Sign Contacted, State/Province/DX, and Ohio State Park Identifier received for all QSOs as applicable.
- LOGS MUST BE LEGIBLE TO BE SCORED. Any incomplete, illegible or otherwise unable to be scored logs will be considered as check logs at the discretion of the Ohio State Parks On The Air committee.
- Paper logs must be sent to the address listed below and must be postmarked no later than 30 days after the end of the contest.
- Mailed entries must include both the completed summary sheet and the logs.
- E-mailed logs with a completed summary sheet may be sent to the e-mail address below and must be sent in no later than 30 days after the end of the contest.
- Paper entry forms and operating aids (rules, summary sheets, log sheet, Ohio State Park identifiers, and other information) are available for downloading in PDF format from the Ohio State Parks On The Air web site at: <http://parks.portcars.org>
- Final results will be posted on the Ohio State Parks On The Air web site.

Awards

- Certificates will be awarded to:
- Top five single operator entries - Low Power in an Ohio State Park category
- Top five single operator entries - High Power in an Ohio State Park category
- Top five club entries - Low Power in an Ohio State Park category
- Top five club entries - High Power in an Ohio State Park category
- Top five individuals Ohio
- Top five non-Ohio individuals
- Overall high score entry
- Club activating the most Ohio State Parks
